**Committees**

The Graduate School "Human Behaviour in Social and Economic Change" consists of the director and four advisory boards:

- Executive Board
- Equal Opportunity Commissioner
- Assessment Committee
- Scientific Advisory Board

With exception of the Scientific Advisory Board all committees were elected. In the following we will introduce the several committees and explain their tasks.

*Director*

The director is the head of the GSBC. It is a full time position for a 5-year period. The current director is Uwe Cantner.

*Executive Board*

The Executive Board is the managing body of the GSBC, consisting of seven members: 3 faculty members, one Post-doc, 2 doctoral students and the director. This board is responsible for the research training programme. At the moment the committee consist of Amélie Mummendey, Hartmut Rosa, Rainer Silbereisen and Uwe Cantner as director. The remaining positions have to be staffed later.

*Equal Opportunity Commissioner*

The Equal Opportunity Commissioner is responsible for the development of equal opportunity action plan. He or she is a full member of the assessment committee and mentor for PhD students and Post-Docs. The current Equal Opportunity Commissioner is Melanie C. Steffens.

*Assessment committee*

The task of the assessment committee is to recruit and select doctoral students and Post-docs. The board consists of three faculty members and the equal opportunity commissioner. The faculty members are Klaus Dörre, Oliver Kirchkamp and Klaus Rothermund.

*Scientific Advisory Board*

The Scientific Advisory Board monitors and evaluates the school's strategies, long-term planning and development. It consists of international experts and representatives of the Friedrich-Schiller-University Jena and meets at least once a year. Three of the seven members are elected by university and three by the GSBC board. The director of the Graduate Academy is the head of the Scientific Advisory Board.

## 2. Summer Schools 2008

### ***2nd Jena Summer Academy on "Innovation and Uncertainty"***

The Summer School taking place from 28.07.2008 till 09.08.2008 is part of the 2nd Jena Graduate Academy on "Innovation and Uncertainty" and it is part of the EIC's study program. It intends to cover the broader perspective of the EIC – research agenda, providing the participants with a solid orientation concerning the general topic as a whole and the position of their respective PhD projects in particular. The Summer Academy is organized by the EIC in close cooperation with the International Max Planck Research School on Adapting Behavior in a Fundamentally Uncertain World (IMPRS).

The Summer School includes interactive courses, group works and joint seminars. The interactive courses will be given by internationally accepted external lecturer on topics that are related to the core elements of our graduate colleague: Economics of Innovation, Experimental Economics and Entrepreneurship. The group works are a joint event together with PhD students of the IMPRS. Here, an interdisciplinary group of PhD students is working on a recent topic over several weeks with the aim of a joint working paper. The joint seminars are events of both EIC and IMPRS. Here, outstanding lecturer will give presentations on topics which are bridging the gap between the research foci of both groups. Lecture courses:

### ***The 2nd IMPRS Uncertainty Summer School***

As last year, there will be another four-week Summer School organized by the "International Max Planck Research School on Adapting Behavior in a Fundamentally Uncertain World". The IMPRS Uncertainty Summer School aims at stimulating the scientific discourse on decision making under uncertainty between economists, psychologists and legal scholars.

This 2nd Summer School will be held at the Max Planck Institute of Economics Jena from July 28 – August 22, 2008 and it is part of the doctoral program of the IMPRS Uncertainty. The Summer School is a coordinated event with the Summer School of the DFG Graduate School "The Economics of Innovative Change".
